


Our Pupil Premium provision is aimed at accelerating progress so the vast majority of PP pupils leave the School at, or above, the national average. We also aim for every child to make progress that is good or better, so that they leave having made at minimum 2 levels of progress from KS1 to KS2. The annual achievement of PP pupils at St Neot will be measured against the annual national achievement benchmarks of non-PP pupils. Funding will also be used to develop high aspirations for the future so that children can continue to succeed.



Before and after school clubs are designed to help parents balance work and family commitments whilst



providing children with study support and offering them a broad range of experience and interest.
