
Key Vocabulary	
Monastery	A monastery was a place where groups of men or women could live together and worship God.
Mansion	A mansion is a large and often luxurious house. It can be big enough for an owner, his family, and their many servants.
Gatehouse	A small house at the gate into a castle, park, or other large building or area of land.
Scullery	A scullery is a room in a house, traditionally used for washing up dishes and laundering clothes.
Pantry	A cool room that was used to store cooked food and ice.
Day Nursery	Where the young children played and ate their meals, watched over by their nanny.
Night Nursery	The night nursery is where the very young children slept.
National Trust	The National Trust is a charity and membership organisation for heritage conservation in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
