Our Vision



Our Mission is:

Rights Respecting School

- UNICEF promote schools using the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.
- There are 54 rights, however the first 42 are the ones that focus on children's right.
- It encourages children to understand their rights, how to talk about their rights and how to recognise where their rights are being infringed.
- The rights embed values in daily school life and gives children the best chance to lead happy, healthy lives and to be responsible, active citizens.

Rights Respecting School

- Each week we have an assembly that focuses on an 'Article of the Week'.
- We explore the right, discuss what it looks like in their lives and the lives of other children around the world. We talk about why that right is important and what their life would be like it the right was not upheld.
- Our assemblies are also themed for school events, such as Remembrance or Anti-bullying week.
- We also use videos and real life recounts to further help the children understand their rights.



Rights Respecting School

- The school has already been awarded the Rights Respecting Bronze Award.
- We are working towards the Rights Respecting Silver Award, however it is optional whether we will apply for it and it will take quite some time to achieve this.
