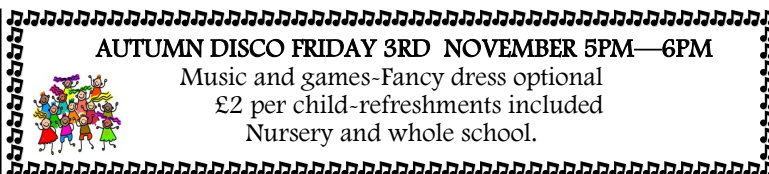

ST NEOT PTA 100 CLUB

The PTA 100 Club is now open for 2023-24. The 100 Club is a private lottery and is open to all parents, grandparents, carers, staff and friends of St. Neot Primary School.
