<b>Monastery</b>	A monastery was a place where groups of men or women could live together and worship God.
<b>Mansion</b>	A mansion is a large and often luxurious house. It can be big enough for an owner, his family, and their many servants.
<b>Gatehouse</b>	A small house at the gate into a castle, park, or other large building or area of land.
<b>Scullery</b>	A scullery is a room in a house, traditionally used for washing up dishes and laundering clothes.
<b>Pantry</b>	A cool room that was used to store cooked food and ice.
<b>Day Nursery</b>	Where the young children played and ate their meals, watched over by their nanny.
<b>Night Nursery</b>	The night nursery is where the very young children slept.
<b>National Trust</b>	The National Trust is a charity and membership organisation for heritage conservation in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
