REMINDERS

A nationwide lockdown has now begun. We ask all parents to follow the national government guidelines. To keep everyone safe, we would like to remind you of the following procedures for drop-off and pick-up:

- Do not congregate outside the school grounds.
- Keep 2 metres distance between families.
- Ensure only one adult is present for drop-off and pick-up.
- Continue to use the one-way system, moving as swiftly as possible during drop-off and pick-up.
- Please do not enter the school grounds without a scheduled appointment.
- If your child is at Breakfast Club or Riverside, please call the school so that a member of staff can supervise your child to the gate.
- Continue to encourage good personal hygiene at all times, in particular regular and thorough handwashing as per government guidelines.

Your child will need to continue to bring in a water bottle and healthy snack every day unless they are in Foundation.
