E-SAFETY UPDATE FROM CORNWALL LEARNING

Five things parents should consider before buying games consoles

Age appropriateness

Some games consoles have a greater number of games suitable for younger children-Nintendo, 3DS and Wii U

Online purchases

Prevent children from accidentally buying a game or spending money through in-game purchasing

Multiplayer networks

Use parental controls settings to avoid children playing against people they don't know

Parental Controls

Set up parental controls straight away to ensure your child doesn't access inappropriate content

Standby mode

Turn devices off so that they do not remain connected to the internet and download content when they are not in use.
