Our Pupil Premium provision is aimed at accelerating progress so the vast majority of PP children leave the School at, or above, the national average. We also aim for every child to make progress that is good or better, so that they transition to secondary being school ready. The annual achievement of PP pupils at St Neot is measured against the annual national achievement benchmarks of non-PP pupils. Funding is also used to develop high aspirations for the future so that children can continue to succeed.

Before and after school clubs are designed to help parents balance work and family commitments whilst



providing children with study support

and offering them a broad range of experience and interest.
