A Parent Guide to Google Classroom

Google Classroom is a space where your child can access their learning online. It is available through a laptop or Chromebook as well as a downloadable app on most tablets and smartphones, you can even access it through the Xbox and PlayStation consoles.

Below are instructions for how you and your child can log on and access their remote learning.

Username and Password

Each child has a unique username and password to log on. Their username is made up of their first name, a full stop, their surname and then the school email domain. For example, a child called Jane Smith, their username would be: jane.smith@st-neot.cornwall.sch.uk

Your child will also have a password. These details will be in the front of their reading record books. Please keep this information safe. We suggest you take a photograph on your phone to refer to.

If you need help with this, please contact your child's teacher.

Accessing Google Classroom

There are many ways to access Google Classroom.

If you are using a **Desktop PC, Mac or laptop**, this can be done by clicking on this link <https://classroom.google.com> or typing it into the search bar on your browser.

If you are using a **Chromebook**, you will need to download the Google Classroom app from the Web Store. Once done, you or your child can sign in using their school login. If you are unable to do this, it may be that you will need to login to the Chromebook using your child's username and password instead from the start-up screen.

If you are using an **iPad or other tablet or smartphone**, please download the free Google Classroom app from the App Store.

If you are using **Xbox One & Xbox Series X/S**, please follow the step below:

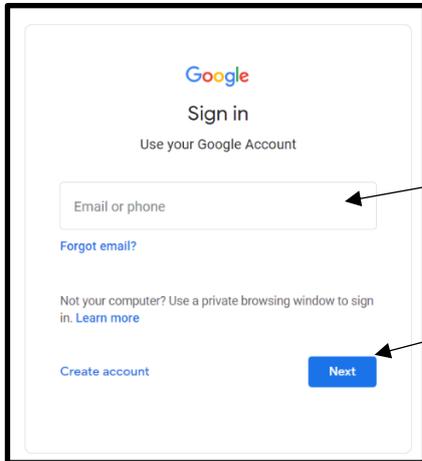
1. Plug a wired keyboard into your Xbox One, Xbox Series X or Xbox Series S via one of the USB ports on the front or back.
2. Press the Xbox button top-centre of a game controller and head to "My games & apps" in the side menu.
3. Click on "See all", scroll down to "Apps" and you will see Microsoft Edge in the icons on the right-hand side. Open it.
4. Type classroom.google.com into the URL bar at the top and log in as you would on a PC using your username and password.
5. You can either use an Xbox controller to move the cursor or a separate USB mouse plugged into one of the other ports.

If you are using **PS4 & PS5**, please follow the steps below:

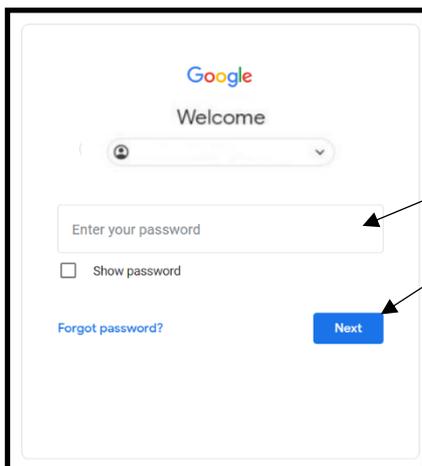
1. Plug a wired keyboard and/or mouse into the USB ports on the PS4 or PS5 - each console should recognise them.

2. Identify the PlayStation internet browser (it is the WWW icon with dots around it) in the URL bar of the browser, type classroom.google.com and then log in using your username and password.

When you arrive at <https://classroom.google.com/> you will see the screen pictured below:

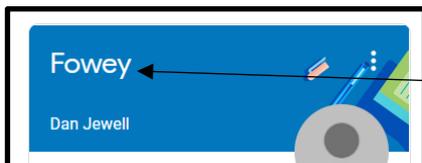


To sign in you or your child should enter their username as detailed above. This needs to be the full username, for example, jane.smith@st-neot.cornwall.sch.uk
Click next.

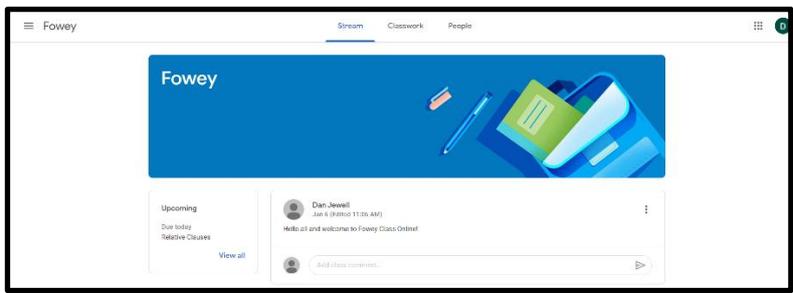


Now enter their password, which is case sensitive.
Click next.

On the first login, some boxes will appear. Please click 'Accept' on the first box. Please click 'Continue' on the second box. Please click 'I'm a student' on the third box.



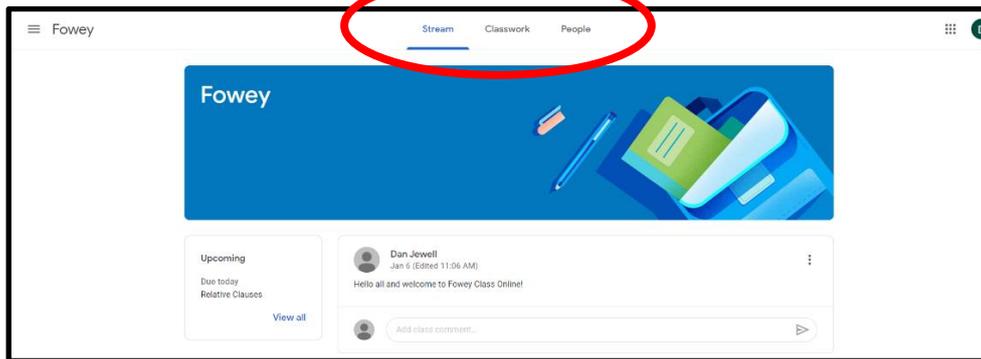
Click on the name of their school classroom to enter their Google Classroom.



Your child's class area will look like this (with their own class name displayed).

Navigating Google Classroom

From the main class screen, you and your child will be able to navigate to the different parts of their classroom. Across the top of the page you will see the following areas:



Stream

This is where your child will see posts from their teachers. Posts may contain links to websites, classwork set by your child’s teacher or simple communications between all the members of the class.

Posts are always monitored by your child’s teacher, as are any accompanying comments made by individuals, so we ask that children only use this feature if they are asking a question about their work or responding sensibly to a post.

Classwork

This is where you and your child will access their online learning assignments set by the teacher. This is the best way of accessing the content set rather than having to worry about searching on the Stream. Any assignments added will be in the form of a Google Doc, Google Slide or other Google Suite app (If you are using a tablet, you may be required to download additional free apps) as this will allow the children to edit and hand in their work individually to the teacher. Teachers will be able to see your child’s progress and support them where necessary and can add comments to the children’s work.

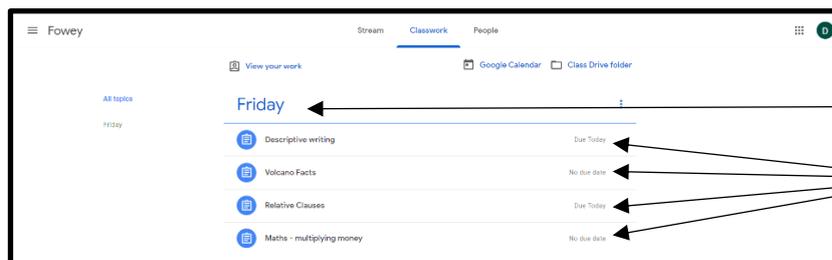
If your child is stuck with a piece of work, they can post a comment using the private message function at the right hand side of the screen to message the teacher. Please note that teachers may not be able to respond to messages straight away.

People

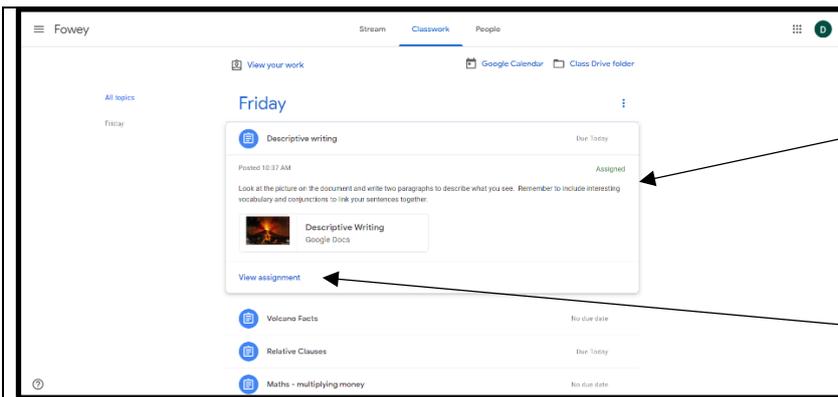
This area shows which teachers and pupils are assigned to the same classroom.

Assignments – ‘How to’ Guide

Assignments are the online learning tasks set by your child’s teacher. They are found in the Classwork area of Google Classroom. Please follow the example below as a guide to opening, completing and submitting an assignment.

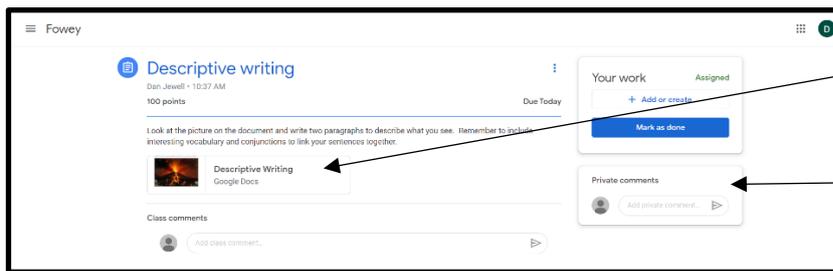


Under the topic headings you will find grouped assignments.



By clicking on an assignment it will expand and provide more information and any files.

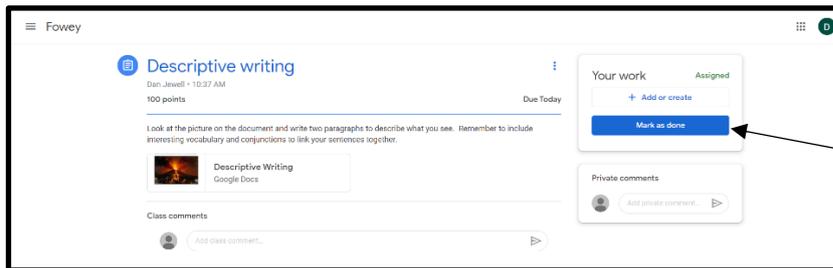
You can then click 'View assignment'.



Click on files to open them.

Type and post private comments for the teacher here.

This is where you or your child could ask their teacher questions about that assignment. You can open any attached files and undertake the activities. All files save automatically to your child's Google Drive, so you don't need to worry about saving or losing work.



When an assignment is complete, click 'Mark as done' to submit it to the teacher.

The teacher can then look at the submitted work and provide feedback.
