### E-SAFETY NEWS FROM NSPCC-ONLINE GROOMING

Figures show that 3,171 grooming offences have been recorded in England and Wales across 80 platforms in England and Wales since a new anti-grooming law was introduced last year which criminalises sexual communication with a child.
