Children sometimes have spills at school and we change them into clean clothes. However, we are running out of spares as these are not being returned. If you have any of our clothes at home could you please make sure they are clean and return them asap, particularly socks and pants, thank you.

COVID-19 - Information for Parents and Carers

The school has received advice from the Department for Education, the NHS, Public Health England and the National Institute of Clinical Excellence. The following advice will be shared in school, but you may wish to reemphasise the importance. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to the virus and there are general principles anyone can follow to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including: washing your hands often - with soap and water, or use alcohol sanitiser if handwashing facilities are not available - this is particularly important after

covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throwing the tissue in a bin, or where tissues are not available, coughing/sneezing into the inside of

your elbow (rather than into your hands); people who feel unwell should stay at home and should not attend work or any education or childcare setting;

use hand sanitiser that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available;

avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands;

avoid close contact with people who are unwell;

clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces;

- if you are worried about your symptoms or those of a child or colleague, please call NHS 111 do not go directly to your GP or other healthcare
- face masks for the general public, students or staff are not recommended to protect from infection as there is no evidence of benefit from their use outside healthcare environments.

From all of the expert advice we have been given, there is no need for panic or alarm, but I am sure you will appreciate that it is sensible for us to take precautions, remain vigilant and be prepared in order to safeguard our learning community
