At St Neot Primary School, we are committed to supporting the positive mental health and well-being of our whole school community; children, staff, parents and carers.

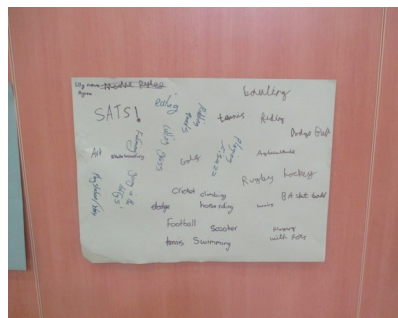
