PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE

Thank you to everyone who has returned the parent questionnaire. A few points have been raised: Why do we not do clubs for Foundation children? We have found in the past that children who have just started school are very tired so we don't offer clubs to this age group until later in the year. My child would like different clubs to those offered? We are limited by the amount of people able to run clubs, staff have meetings and training after school as well as running clubs; if any parent would like to offer to run one that isn't already on offer please let us know. Could there be more focus on children's well-being? Whilst our main focus is on learning we do spend a lot of time letting the children talk to us about how they are feeling, offering opportunities to them to talk to us and to each other. We discuss concerns and issues in School Council meetings and assemblies. PSHE lessons include mental health, emotional well-being and living in the wider world. Our Wild Tribe focus this term is pupil well-being.
