



Key Language in Context

¿A qué hora abre la pizzería?

At what time does the pizza restaurant open?

Abre a las dos y media.

It opens at half past two.

¿A qué cierra la cafetería?

At what time does the cafe close?

Cierra a las diez.

It closes at ten.

¿Qué pizza desea?

What pizza would you like?

Quisiera una pizza con pepperoni y queso, sin cebolla.

I would like a pepperoni and cheese pizza, without onion.

¿Qué bebida desea?

What drink would you like?

Quisiera un refresco, por favor.

I would like a soft drink, please.

¿Qué postre desea?

What dessert would you like?

Quisiera un helado, por favor.

I would like an ice cream, please.

Key Knowledge and Grammar

Adjectives that end in **-o** in the masculine singular form end in **-a** in the feminine singular form, e.g. El café es **delicioso** [The coffee is delicious] and La fruta es **deliciosa** [The fruit is delicious].

Adjectives that end in **-e** or in a consonant in the masculine singular form don't change in the feminine singular form, e.g. El helado es **dulce** [The ice cream is sweet] and La ensalada es **horrible** [The salad is horrible].

If the item you are describing is **plural**, remember to **add an -s at the end of the adjective**, e.g. Las patatas fritas son **saladas** [The crisps are savoury].
